

Goal: Support an Additional 250,000 Caring Adults Serving as Tutors, Mentors, and Other High-Impact Roles by Summer 2025.

Academic Tutors



A form of teaching, 1:1 or in a small group, towards a specific goal. High-impact tutoring leads to months of additional learning gains for students by supplementing (but not replacing) students' classroom experiences.

Student Success Coaches

Wraparound/Integrated Student Supports



Enable schools to build strong connections and systems with community health, mental health, and social service providers; and put school climate plans and multi-tiered systems of support into action.

Post-Secondary Transition Coaches



Support postsecondary exposure, college search and fit/match, college application creation, financial aid applications, and navigation of postsecondary

Mentors



Help youth explore and affirm their identity, provide navigational support around school-towork transitions, and buffer against adversity in and out of school.



INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION

- Use at least 15 percent of Federal Work-Study (FWS) funds to compensate college students employed in community service activities, devoting any increase in FWS compensation for community service to employment in NPSS roles located in schools or out-of-school time programs; OR
- Significantly increase the number of college students in NPSS roles regardless of the funding source supporting these roles.

SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME PROVIDERS

- Establish programs focused on these student supports;
- Engage with local and regional colleges and universities to establish partnerships that will enable college students to fill NPSS roles in schools and out-of-school time programs; or
- Partner with other local government agencies and community-based organizations to place caring adults in NPSS roles.

· FEDERAL WORK-STUDY

- The federal share of compensation paid for these roles can be much more generous than other FWS roles
- The federal share of FWS compensation can reach 100 percent when:
 - the college student is employed as a reading or math tutor for school-aged children or when performing qualifying family literacy activities or civic education activities.
- The federal share of FWS compensation can be as high as 90 percent when
 - a college student is employed at a nonprofit or at a federal, state, or local public agency, subject to FWS requirements, including those at 34 CFR 675.

· AMERICORPS

 Department of Education funds may be used to fulfill matching requirements for AmeriCorps programs, which can support NPSS roles.
